The policies are as follows:

➤ **Policy On Communication**

- Deploying effective communication channels to serve as a point of touch between students, the ACSC and Management.
- Creating an Alumni platform that will foster continuous collaboration and networking opportunities among all ACitizens.
- Initiating what we will call the **Humans of ACity**, a platform to encourage students to share their unique perspectives through the concept of sharing their stories and ideas.

➤ **Policy On Developing The Human Capacity Of Students**

- The Agyenkwa Initiative
- Hold Financial Literacy Talks
- Organize the ACity Ideon Talk
- Liaising with management to create a recreational space; one with an artistic impression where students can resort to for socialization, relaxation and to view artworks by fellow students.

➤ **Policy On External Collaborations**

- Creating avenues to foster student-oriented relationships and programs between ACitizens and other student bodies both locally and internationally.
- Creating relationships with neighboring restaurants and pubs



Last but not least, one of the critical issues we hope to address is the issue of mutual respect and **embracing** companionship in this community. We must understand that it is difficult for some people to find their voice and be able to articulate their views and experiences to tell their story, partly because of certain wrong perceptions of them. Under my leadership, we hope to partly use the concept of the **Humans of ACity** to help such students find their voice. They would be able to tell their story so that we would see them in a new light, we would start recognizing our own experiences in each other and in that, see that we are one.
